

# **Reflux Awareness** Week 2022 Update

In November 2022, we launched the third successful UK Reflux Awareness Week!

With over 13% of the UK population suffering from Gastro-Oesophageal Reflux disease, we believe that raising awareness of the symptoms, how to get tested and what the various treatment options are is critical to maintaining a healthy oesophagus.

#### Our key messages of the campaign were:

1. Get Educated - Reflux is so much more than just heartburn. There are various symptoms that are associated with this disease,


and we wanted to make as many people as possible aware of this.

- 2. Get Evaluated For some patients, diet and lifestyle changes are not enough to alleviate the symptoms and for these patients, we wanted to raise awareness of the different tests that patients can undertake to determine the exact extent of their disease so that the appropriate treatment plans can be offered.
- 3. Get Treated We wanted to make sure patients were educated about all the different treatment options available to them to have an informed conversation with their GP or Reflux Centre.

We set aside a specific section on our website to highlight the Awareness Week, and we conducted an extensive social media campaign that reached individuals throughout the entire nation.

As a result, we not only expanded our follower base on social media but also achieved our highest website performance to date. Furthermore, we distributed informative materials to patients and healthcare professionals through posters, awareness packs, newsletters, and mailshots.

We eagerly anticipate this year's Awareness Week, 20th-26th November 2023, during which we will build upon the successes and insights gained from our efforts in 2022.




## **Toms 300ft Bungee Jump**

"In May, my brother in law, aged just 48, was diagnosed with cancer of the Gastroesophageal junction, it is T4. He has had so many scans just to get to this point and a few weeks ago he had a JEJ feed tube fitted as eating and swallowing has been restricted. He will be starting his 4 cycles of FLOT chemotherapy next week. If the tumour responds to this, he will then undergo gruelling surgery to remove the junction of the oesophagus and all of his stomach, to hopefully remove all the cancer. Then after this a short break before more chemotherapy to mop up any other cancerous cells that may have been left behind. The OPA cancer charity offers information and help to people and families going through this journey. Shaving my head is the least I can do to raise some vital funds, please support me on our family journey." - Tina Saxton


